The visiting members included Mr. Hugh Salmon (Head of the Technical Consultancy Unit from Family for Every Child), Mr. Chaste Uwihoreye (Uyisenga Ni Imanzi, Rwanda) and Mr. Abubeker Naser (Forum on Sustainable Children's Empowerment, Ethiopia). It was a three-day intensive cross learning programme during which the visiting team got to understand and reflect upon Butterflies' approach and best practices to work with children.

Butterflies Sports Day


